TOPIC SIX TEACHER NOTES

Goals for the Student

- Identify items of clothing in English.
- Identify some colors
- Say, *His shirt is blue*. And complete drills of other words with *color*, and *possessives*
- Tell time. by fives. Its five after one. It's five 'till one.
- Use yesterday, today, tomorrow.

Notes to the teacher

Review *broken, fixed* and some *time*. Combine as much as possible from the previous four topics.

Suggestions

- 1. Try to find a box of clothes or some pictures to illustrate the new vocabulary. Have the students identify the clothing after you've taught the new words. Let students pick out one item or picture they like, and one they don't like.
- 2. Total Physical Response (TPR): *Give me the shoes, Pass me the shirt.* Play a game: *Pass the* ___. Have students ask the question, *Will you give me a shirt, pants,* etc.
- 3. Drill *verbs* like *wear*, *pass*, etc. These verbs are easy to act out.
- 4. Have student say: *My daughter likes red blouses. My son likes blue jeans.,* etc.
- 5. Demonstrate *in front of, behind.* Play a *line* game. Line up students. Have them tell who is in front and who is behind by saying things like *The red blouse is in front of the blue shirt. The white shirt is behind the yellow shirt,* etc.
- 6. Review *colors* with the clothing. Review *possessive*. *My red shirt*, etc.
- 7. If they already know the above:
 - a. Ask what they wore yesterday and today.

Reading and Writing Exercises

- 1. Write model sentences on the board. My mother likes dresses. She doesn't wear pants. She doesn't like pants. She wants me to wear dresses. My sister likes her yellow dress. Which dress do you like? How much does it cost?
- 2. Drill all the new verbs. Statement, question, negative.

Materials You Will Need

- Box of old clothes or pictures of clothing.
- Color items to review colors.
- Simon says: Touch your shirt, jeans, belt, etc.
- Have any handouts you chose copied and ready for your class.
- Something with a zipper and buttons.

Pronunciation tip

In the chant: Why Don't You Wear It, the don't you actually sounds like don'tchew. In conversational English, when the verb ends in a T sound, and the next word is you or your, link the /t/ with you, and it sounds like chew. /ch/
