TOPIC TWELVE TEACHER NOTES

Goals for the student

- Locate major streets on a map.
- Know names of public buildings.
- Be able to give directions from one area to another.
- Be able to give directions inside a building from one area to another.
- Ask directions to a place, for example: Where can I find the gas station?

Notes to the teacher

The twelfth topic should discuss the community, giving directions, and reading a local map. Mark several places on the map before you start.

Suggestions

- 1. Bring maps of your area to class. You can draw a pretend map on the board.
- 2. Role play directions. Mark certain areas in the classroom and move chairs to make roads and blocks. Have one student give directions in the classroom or teaching area, and another student follows them.
- 3. Answer questions about locations of things in your area.
- 4. Teach north, south, east, and west.
- 5. Teach how to say letters, like GPS.
- 6. Obtain a map of your state. Have the students plan a trip to another part of the state. Have them orally explain their trip to the class.

- 7. Assign the students to make a travel poster of a place to visit in your area.
- 8. Trace bus or train routes on your county or city map.
- 9. If they already know most of the lesson, go deeper:
 - a. Talk about other location and driving problems. Talk about road signs and driver's license.

- Something to represent a traffic light, and a stop sign


